






Leadership is an important

ATL SKILLS THAT REFLECT LEADERSHIP QUALITIES

- > Listen actively and respectfully while others speak
- > Give and receive meaningful feedback
- > Help others to succeed
- > Be aware of own and others emotions

- > Take responsibility for one's own actions
- > Practise empathy
- > Set goals that are challenging and realistic
- > Practise positive thinking




FIVE PRACTICES FOR BECOMING AN EXEMPLARY LEADER





MODEL THE WAY


Leaders clarify values by finding their voice and affirming shared values.
Set the example by aligning actions with shared values.



ENABLE OTHERS TO ACT


Foster collaboration by building trust and facilitating relationships.


